

## Primary School Sport Funding 2017-2018

The government is providing additional funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools; however schools will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Windlesham Village Infant School will receive £8000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil for each academic year to improve our provision of PE across the whole school. This academic year, we have spent more than our allocated budget. The total number of children on roll in January 2017 was 167, resulting in additional funding of £835, making a total of £8835. We have been proactive in seeking out ways to improve the opportunities for the pupils at Windlesham and we have assigned our funding to:

During the academic year 2018 – 2019 Windlesham will be continuing to increase the opportunities for high quality PE in school by:

1. Develop play equipment and space in the back playground
2. Continuing to develop the Key Stage 1 PE curriculum; use of a scheme to support planning
3. Promote engagement with extra-curricular clubs, particularly for Pupil Premium pupils
4. Continue to promote active playtimes through use of lunchtime clubs

These actions will be monitored closely by the governing body.
