

Our Value this half term is:

Appreciation

In P.E our topic is Fitness. We will work on our skills for running, jumping, co-ordination, stamina, strength, agility and balance. We will also be developing our communication and co-operation skills.

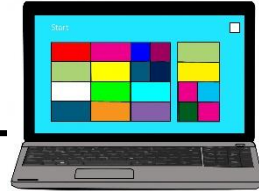
In PSHE, our topic is 'Economic wellbeing'. We will learn how money is kept safe and the role of banks and building societies. We will explore a range of different jobs that exist in and out of school and recognise that different skills are needed for different jobs.



In Music our unit is 'Musical Vocabulary'. We will be learning to move and create sounds to reflect a character. We will move at different speeds to reflect the tempo of the music and respond to dynamic changes. In singing, we will sing both high and low sounds and respond to symbols showing this correctly.



In Computing, our unit is about technology within and outside of school. We will find and understand examples of where technology is used in the local community.

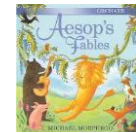
In Art, our unit is 'Woven Wonders'. We will look at what materials can be cut, knotted, threaded or plaited. We will wrap objects/shapes in wool, measure lengths and learn how to tie simple knots. We will then look at how to weave with paper on a paper loom.

In DT, we are looking at healthy eating and making our own smoothies using a range of different fruits. We will be testing out the fruits we want to use and learning a range of different methods to prepare the fruit including chopping and juicing.

In RE we will be focussing on the question:

Why do people tell stories?

In this unit we will be looking at a range of religious and non-religious stories and considering how these can help people. For example, we will look at the Aesop's fable The Hare and the Tortoise and think about what the message of this story is.



In Geography we will be learning about our local park. We will be looking at maps of the local area and planning our route using journey lines. We will be going on a field trip to the Windlesham Field of Remembrance to find out what facilities are in the local park and discuss ways in which it can be improved. We will be using tallying to help us record information and will use this data to make a class pictogram.



ENGLISH

Writing:

During this term we will be working on being consistent with punctuation including capital letters, full stops, question marks and exclamation marks. We will be working on sentence composition and re-reading our work to check it makes sense.

Handwriting:

This half term we will be focusing on the zig zag monster letter family in our handwriting sessions.



PHONICS

In our phonics sessions this term we will be revising all of the sounds we have learned this year as well as exploring the more uncommon phonemes and graphemes.



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SCIENCE

Our science topic this half term is:

Animals:

In this unit we will learn to name and describe the physical features of a range of animals. Sort animals into groups based on their similarities and differences. Identify characteristics specific to mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians and fish and recall the diets of carnivores, herbivores and omnivores

Reading

This half term we are looking at developing our reading comprehension skills. When we share books in class we are thinking about:

- Making predictions - thinking about what might happen and why we think that.
- Discussing the story settings and characters.
- Discussing key vocabulary and their meanings.

MATHS

Fractions

We will learn to find halves and quarters of shapes objects and quantities and recognise that to be a fraction there needs to be equal pieces or groups.

Mass and Volume

We will be using comparative terms such as heavier and lighter, full and empty. Measuring and comparing mass, volume and capacity.

Place Value within 100

In this unit we will be learning to partition numbers above 50 into tens and ones and recognise the place value of each digit in a 2-digit number. We will use this knowledge to compare numbers. We will also learn to find one more and one less than a given number.

Money

In this short unit we will be learning to recognise coins and notes.

Time

We will revise our knowledge of the days of the week and the months of the year. We will be introduced to the analogue clock and to recognise and make o'clock and half past on a clock face.
