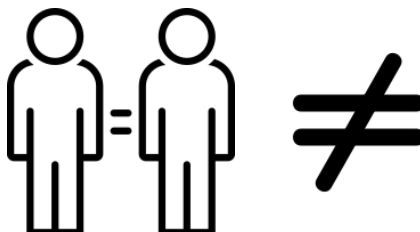
I know a capital city is a city in a country where the government meet to talk about the country.
