

Year 2 - Is Windlesham a Good Place to Live?

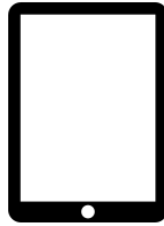
I can give directions for someone to follow on a map using compass points (north, south, east, west, north east/west, south east/west).
