We felt he answered our questions well and he was very interested in our school.


















Attendance

New Technology

With Christmas nearly here and with some children receiving new technology or related games, here is a quick reminder of the importance of setting up appropriate parental controls.

Games/Consoles

- Check age ratings: look at the PEGI rating of any new games.
- Remember, PEGI rates the gameplay so whilst it is important to review age ratings, you must also check to see if it has any communication elements.
- If a game does allow your child to communicate with others, then adjust or disable the settings as appropriate to your child.

Admissions

Children enter the Reception Class aged between four and five. Admission is without reference to ability or aptitude and is on the basis of equal opportunities.

Windlesham Village Infant School is part of The Alliance Multi-Academy Trust (TAMAT) and is an 'own admission authority' school. However, we remain part of the central admissions system operated by Surrey County Council.

Windlesham Village Infant School has a Published Admission Number (PAN) of 30 for each year group from Reception through to Year 2.

The reason for the consultation is because both schools are closely connected as part of The Alliance Multi Academy Trust and the learning pathway between the two schools is now more aligned. The schools share the same overarching policies, staffing, teaching networks and Trust processes. Both schools benefit from shared resources as well as aligned curriculum expectations with subject leaders working across the schools in networks as well as teachers working together on moderation of learning, teaching and learning reviews and shared trust projects between staff and pupils.


