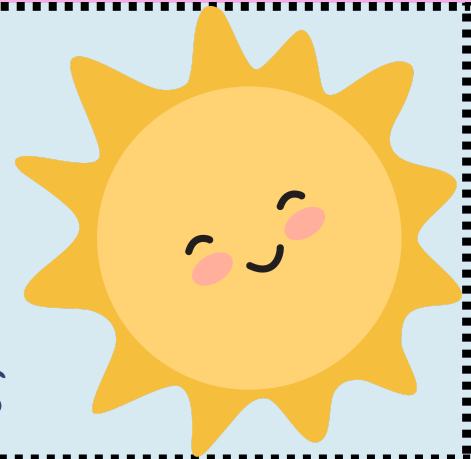

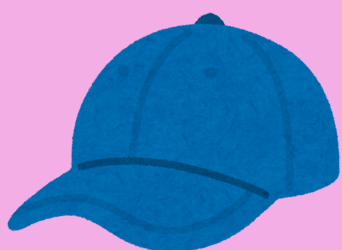
It's the summer term! The year really feels like it is whizzing by. This half-term will feel short, because it is only 5 weeks long, with an additional Bank Holiday on 5th May.

As the seasons change, the weather can catch us out, with heavy showers followed by bright sunshine. Please keep sending in coats, and please start to use sun cream on your child.

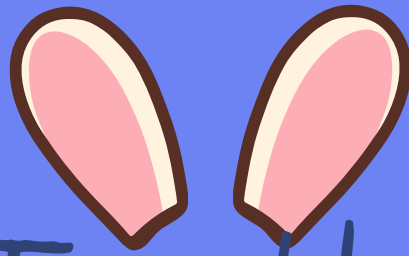
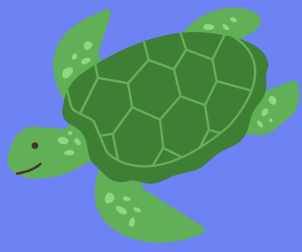

We would welcome extra adults who are DBS-checked to listen to children read.

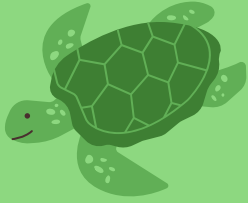
Additionally, help to keep our library tidy would be great-so that all the books are in the right place now we are using it more.

Last week was 'Anaphylaxis Week' and we had a special assembly to talk about allergies.

FIRST AID FOR ANAPHYLAXIS



Recognise the Signs of Anaphylaxis...

A Airways

- Persistent cough
- Hoarse voice
- Difficulty swallowing
- Swollen tongue

B Breathing

- Difficult or noisy breathing
- Wheeze or persistent cough

C Circulation

- Persistent dizziness
- Pale or floppy
- Suddenly sleepy
- Collapse/unconscious

An allergic reaction can escalate to anaphylaxis which is potentially life-threatening. Always consider anaphylaxis in a food-allergic person even if there are no signs of a rash, hives or swelling.

ANAPHYLAXIS: ACTIONS TO TAKE

If any one or more of the above ABC symptoms are present, take these steps.

1. Administer an Adrenaline Auto Injector (AAI) without delay

Inject the AAI into the top of the outer thigh. If you're in doubt that it is anaphylaxis but one or more ABC symptoms are present, give the AAI, it will not harm them.



2. Dial 999 and say anaphylaxis ('ana-fill-axis')

Stay with the person until the ambulance arrives. **DO NOT** let them stand up and walk around.



3. The person should lie down immediately

If the person is not already lying down, they should do so, with legs raised if possible. If breathing is difficult, allow them to sit. If they have vomited or feel sick, gently turn them on their side.

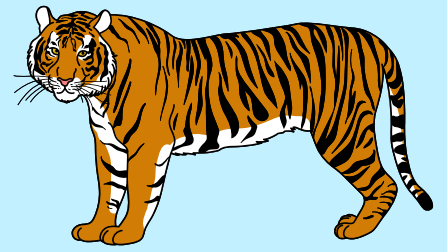


4. Inject a second AAI into the outer thigh if there are no signs of improvement after 5 minutes

If there is no sign of life, start CPR immediately until help arrives.

Please learn these steps. This is life-saving information. You never know when you will need to act in an anaphylaxis emergency.

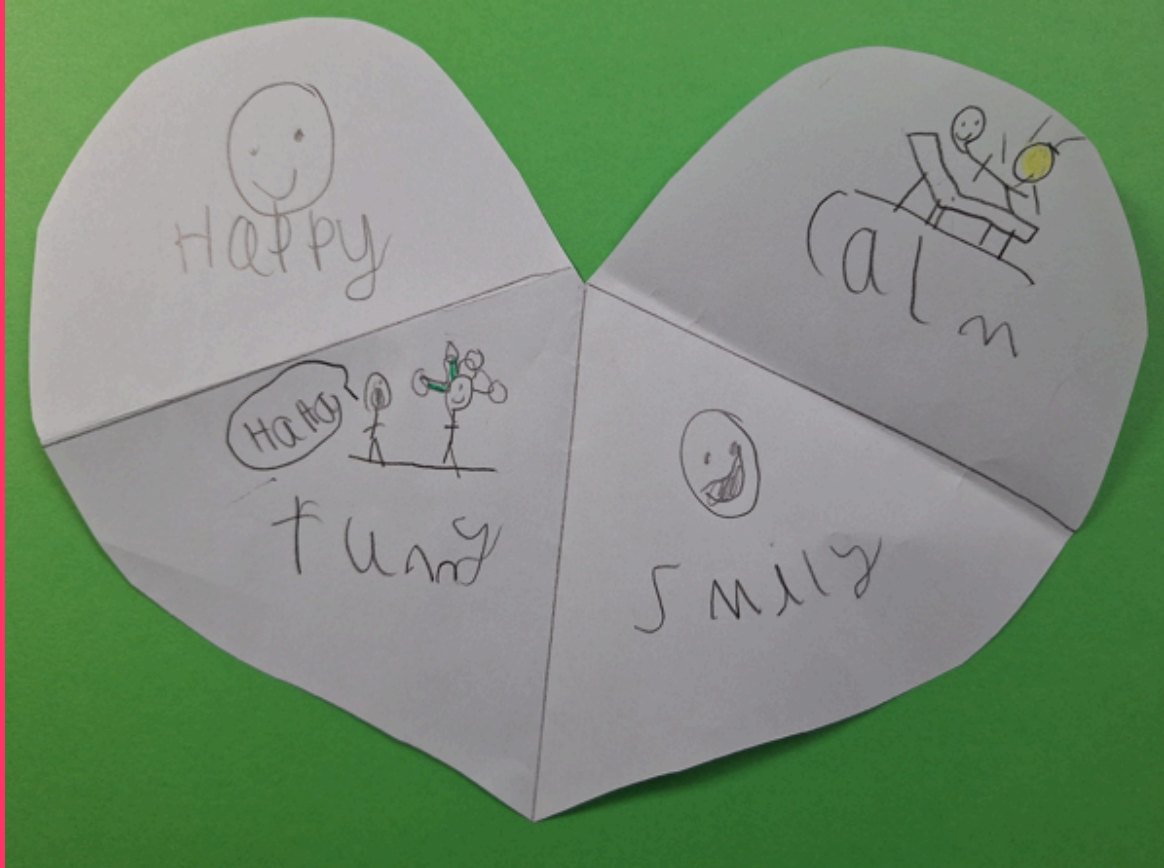


Year 1 walked to St John's Church to learn more about the Easter Story.

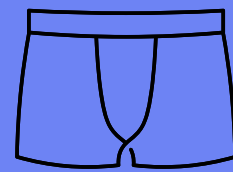
From the school office....

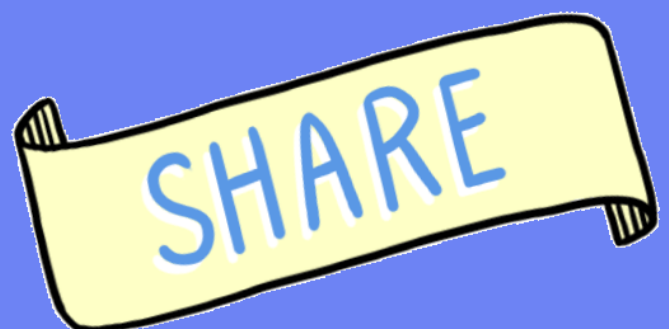

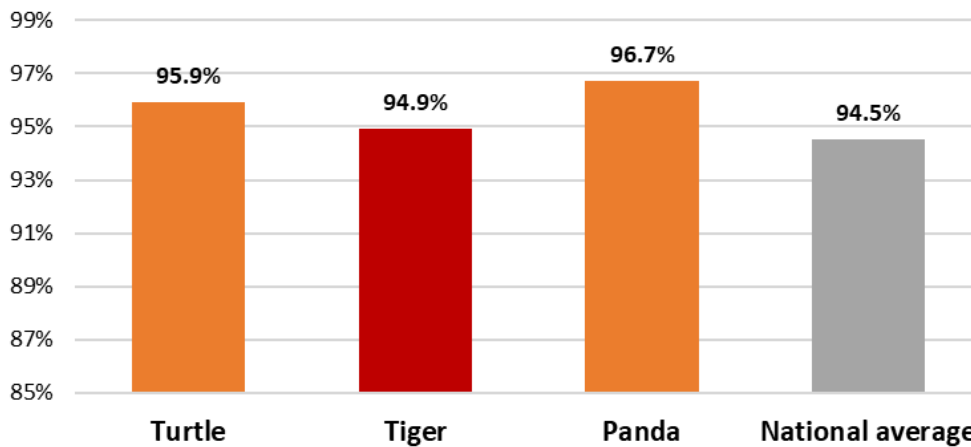

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carers per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carers per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carers per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.
