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THE PARENTS'/CARERS' PROMISE

- To refer to Parent Information Pack and annual updates
- To ensure that your child attends school unless prevented from doing so by illness or other agreed reason. School to be notified on first day of absence.
- To ensure that your child arrives for school before 8.40 am but not earlier than 8.20 am
- To support the Friends by signing up to help at various fundraising events
- To dress your child in the agreed school uniform and name all items including P.E. kit
- To attend consultation meetings with the class teacher
